#### 1. Title of the Practice

## ORIENTATION PROGRAMME IN ENGLISH GRAMMAR

#### 2. Aim

Our College conducts Orientation Programme in English Grammar every year for the Prospective teachers to enhance their communicative ability in English and also academic skills.

#### 3. Objectives of the Practice

The objectives of the Practice include:

- To train the students to read English efficiently with proper pronunciation and stress
- To train the students to write English clearly with correct spelling by understanding the syllables
- To encourage the students to speak in English fluently without Grammar mistakes
- To encourage the students to communicate in English with people on and off campus

#### 4. The Context of the Practice

The distinctiveness of Our College is to uplift the rural students who are economically, culturally and socially backward. Most of the students in our College are hailing from southern region of rural part were they are in desperate need of 21st-century learning and speaking skills to succeed in the new-age learning environment. Moreover the students in rural areas continue to struggle with effective English communication when compared to urban area students as they would get less exposure to English language. Today's prospective teachers are tomorrow's teachers and hence our college has started the practice of giving orientation in English Grammar for First year B.Ed. trainees.

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#### 5. The Practice

Our College organizes Orientation in English Progarmme for First Year B.Ed. trainees every year to bridge the gaps, the growing disparities between urban and rural learning and make the next generation teachers future-ready. The Programme is scheduled for three days. Our faculty members will be the trainers. The First year B.Ed. students are divided in to three groups to attend the need of individual differences. Each teacher educator will teach one topic in English grammar in the Morning session and a test will be conducted in the afternoon session on the topics of grammar taught. The duration of the teaching session will be one hour in the morning and the duration of the test hour will be half-an-hour in the afternoon session. The morning session is scheduled with three periods and the afternoon session was scheduled with four periods. The question paper for the afternoon session will be distributed and the answer sheets will be collected, evaluated to provide feedback and plan for remedy teaching to the needy. The Grammar topics will be the choice of the teacher educator and are enlisted below:

#### 1. Title of the Practice

#### VILLAGE ADOPTION PROGRAMME

#### 2. Aim

Our College adopts a Village from the rural area and conducts various extension activities for the development of the Village.

#### 3. Objectives of the Practice

The objectives of the Practice include:

- To assist the village in assessing the best possible ways of improvement and development that is both affordable and sustainable.
- To identify the potential of the village towards further growth and advances.
- To involve Teacher educators and Prospective teachers in outreach activities.
- To prepare socially responsible future teachers for the nation.

#### 4. The Context of the Practice

The Vision of Our College is "We mould intelligent, morally upright, emotionally matured and spiritually elevated teachers from the rural segments of the society to achieve the status of excellence" and as such the college considered the need to branch out and render its services to places beyond the center so that the facility and knowledge of the College may be made available to those outside the college fraternity. The Village Adoption program will also provide many opportunities for Prospective teachers of the college to gain hands-on experience and understanding of the rural population, rural system and habitat. This will in turn generate a knowledge pool, which will be greatly instrumental towards understanding the requirements necessary to make advancements, developments and growth which otherwise was unidentified. The college will also provide a series of educational help by conducting Cleaning activities, special talks, hands-on training, and counselling, vocational training for women in the village, providing equipments to the Panchayat Union School in the village, teaching assistance to the school, etc. on various issues

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related to the problems identified within the village adopted. Although the program is not designed to provide relief to these villages economically, the villages adopted will be provided help from an academic stand point.

#### 5. The Practice

Our College adopts a nearby Village Ganthipuram, in Tiruchendur Taluk. This Village is in Close proximity of our College. The Village adoption Programme of Our College is a self-financed program generated purely out of the goodwill and desire to serve others present within the fraternity of the college. Funds for the program are donated by our management without any funding received from any agency. The college forms a committee with the Principal as the Patron, and the committee decides by conducting various activities on which the Village to be adopted.

The series of activities carried out in the Village include the following:

- Prospective teachers are encouraged and afforded opportunities to participate in programs organized under the Village Adoption Program.
- Teacher Educators and Eminent persons are invited to deliver special lectures.
- Students of the adopted villages are oriented with innovative teaching approaches.
- Prospective teachers are encouraged to engage with the Panchayat Union School of the Village like teaching rhymes, health & hygiene, environmental awareness and fun games.
- Prospective teachers are encouraged to clean the environment of the Village.
- To organize workshops and programs for students and community of the adopted villages.

### 6. Impact of the Practice

The impact of the Practice includes the following:

- Through the Village Adoption Program, the college provides opportunity for Prospective teachers to be a part of a full-fledged Community activity.
- This experience gained by the Prospective teachers under their experienced teacher educators is truly invaluable.
